<p>Tuning in (Introduction) <i>Determine prior knowledge and prepare pupils</i></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Ask the pupils if they recognise what the teacher has in hand. Ask them if they have cook “Maggi” noodle before. Elicit their experience on preparing it. Encourage them to answer in a simple but complete sentence. Give support when needed i.e. _____the pack. (open) _____ the water. (boil) Jot their answers on the board. Discuss the answer and ask the pupils if they make sense and make corrections together when needed. State that each sentence is separated and has no connections with each other at the moment. Ask them what should be added to the sentence to relate them to each other. Elicit sequencing words that they can use to connect the contents together,. Give wait time. Then show them the word cards of basic connectives First, second, next, then, after that, before and finally State that these sequencing words will show the relationship between sentences or content. Then, teacher will state the learning attentions that by the end of the sessions they will be able to <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Identify and use target sequencing words in their writing. Sequence the steps in the task given - how to make a Tuna salad Sandwich. <p>Finding out & Sorting out (Lesson Development) <i>Time to locate, gather information, organise and process ideas.</i></p>	<p><u>How to make a Tuna Salad Sandwich Activity 1: Picture sequencing</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Pupils will be put in groups of four 2. Distribute a set of pictures on how to make a Tuna salad sandwich to each group. 3. Ask them to arrange the pictures in order using their logical thinking. 4. Then let everyone stand and move to other groups (clockwise), let them change their seats. 5. For example: Group 1 → 2 Group 2 → 3 Group 3 → 4 Group 4 → 5 Group 5 → 1 6. Ask them to discuss about the sequence of the pictures that had been arranged by the group on the table that they moved to. 7. Discuss the activity with the class and extract the sequence from the pupils. Paste the ‘sentence cards’ to support their answers. 8. Encourage the pupils to participate in the discussion. 9. Elicit from the pupils the connectives that can be used to link one sentence to another to make it a cohesive text. Paste the connective cards on the board beside the sentence cards. <p><u>How to make a Tuna Salad Sandwich Activity 2: Sentence sequencing</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 10.
