OBJECTIVES

Annotating can be defined as the process of taking notes directly on the text being read. Annotating a literary text (or any text, for that matter) is a valuable, interrogative skill for students to learn and master. This is a skill that teachers should help their students develop in order to encourage independent learning and stimulate their intellectual curiosity. This course then aims to enable course participants to develop annotating strategies that can be employed in the classroom.

CONTENT

Course participants will be developing annotating skills on:

- a prose text,
- a drama text, and
- a poetry text.

TASKS

Course participants will complete a series of activities that involve reading, analysing and discussing literary texts.
